PLEASE READ ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS IN THE FRONT OF THE FAIR BOOK.

General Rules for 4H Achievement and 4H Open Shows:

1. Dress Code: Members not dressed properly will not be allowed into the show ring.
Dairy: the exhibitor must wear clean white pants and shirt and a harness. Steel-toed boots are recommended. Hats are prohibited.
Sheep/Beef/Rabbits: the exhibitor must wear a clean white shirt and black pants. Steel-toed boots are recommended. Hats are prohibited.
2. In order to maintain the integrity of the 4-H program, the 4-H Association, on the recommendation of the beef and dairy leaders, prohibits the use of non-therapeutic drugs on 4-H livestock projects. If drugging is detected, the member responsible would not be allowed to show livestock in any 4-H Class for the rest of the calendar year.
3. All livestock will be verified as the member's 4-H project according to the project information sheet submitted to the Provincial 4-H Coordinator's office by June 1st. Any projects that do not match the information sheet will not be able to show. All Animals require RFID tags to show.
4. Disease: Under no circumstances should an animal exhibiting signs of transmittable disease (ringworm, lice, warts, etc.) be allowed to show. The 4-H member should contact his/her leader immediately if the calf is exhibiting signs of disease.
5. The 4-H animal must be trained and prepared for show by the 4-H member.
6. It is requested that all 4-H Clubs remain on display until show completion.
