General Rules:

1. For all grain crops, Registered or Certified seed must be used, however; seed may be used if grown from registered seed in 2024 for which proof of registration is available.
2. Each field entered for competition must have an area of not less than two hectares.
3. Judging should take place near maturity or at harvest.
4. An exhibit of the product of the competitor's field **MUST** be shown at the fair.
5. For classes 59 and 61, all entries per competitor must come different plots.
6. All crops must have been harvested during the past year (since last Fair) and the entries prepared by the Exhibitor.
